#### Discovery and R&D

The journey begins with identifying active ingredients from chemical, mineral, plant, or biological sources. Researchers develop various pharmaceutical forms like tablets, capsules, and injections.

#### Preclinical Research

This stage involves in vitro studies on microorganisms and cell cultures, as well as in vivo animal studies to determine efficacy and safety. ADME (Absorption, Distribution, Metabolism, Excretion) studies are conducted to understand pharmacokinetics.

#### Clinical Trials

Human trials proceed through Phases I, II, III, and IV, with increasing participant numbers and complexity. These trials rigorously test the drug's safety and efficacy in real-world conditions.

After successful trials, applications (NDA, ANDA, or BLA) are submitted to regulatory bodies like the FDA. Once approved, ongoing safety monitoring continues through pharmacovigilance

programs.

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#### Serious Adverse Event (SAE) Reporting in Pharmacovigilance

1 Identification of SAE

Healthcare professionals or patients recognize a serious adverse event, which may include life-threatening conditions, hospitalization, or significant medical events

2 Initial Report

The SAE is reported to the sponsor or regulatory authorities within a specified timeframe, often within 24 hours of discovery, using standardized forms or electronic systems.

Data Collection and Verification

Detailed information about the event, patient history, and drug exposure is gathered. Medical records and additional tests may be requested to complete the picture.

Assessment and Follow-


Experts evaluate the causal relationship between the drug and the SAE. Follow-up information is collected to track the outcome and any additional developments

A comprehensive report is prepared and submitted to regulatory authorities within legally mandated timetines, ensuring transparency and compliance.

The objectives of the guest lecture were

- To provide an overview of the challenges associated with drug delivery across the blood-brain barrier (BBB).
- To explore innovative nano particulate drug delivery methods.
- To understand advancements in pharmaceutical nanotechnology and its applications in neurological treatments

- 10. Monitoring the mobilization of research funds and ensuring that they are properly utilized and accounted for.

- 4. ### 10. Journal Publications:

- The publications must be full text articles (case presentations, short papers, letters to the editor etc. not included) published in the journals covered by Science Citation Index (SCI)/ Scimago Journal Rank (SJR)/Scopus Indexed Journals/Social Science Citation Index (SSCI)/UGC CARE list indexed and Arts & Humanities Citation Index Journals; for Pharmacy PubMed/SCOPUS/Index Medicus indexed journals.
- Faculty members are encouraged to publish papers only in reputed journals and avoid publications in un-listed paid journals.
- A maximum of two such publications in an academic year will be considered.
- Authors outside the NIPS fraternity are not entitled for this scheme.
- The faculty asking for incentive must be the first/principal author in the research paper. Full amount as per the scheme will be given to the author in a singleauthored publication. The amount shall be equally divided among authors for a multi authored publication.

In order to encourage the faculty and appreciating the long gap between acceptance and publication of the paper in acclaimed journals, the research paper published or accepted should be claimed only once (i.e. either at the time when it is accepted – with the submission of acceptance proof – or when it is published).

**BOOK PUBLICATIONS**: Faculty members who have taken efforts to write and publish books or monographs are encouraged and incentive will be given to the faculty member as per the cap provided:

- 1. If the book/chapter/monograph are contributed by more than one author, the incentive amount will be shared by all the authors equally.
- 2. Published chapters or monographs must have 'NIPS' as the affiliation.

### APPROVAL OF RESEARCH PROPOSALS:


- a) The design and methodology of research undertaken by a member of staff or student, must be submitted to R&D Cell for evaluation and approval, especially if legislation, professional councils or institutions affected by the research require it.
- b) When students hand in research essays, mini-dissertations, dissertations and theses, they must declare that their research has complied with the Code of Research Ethics of NIPS

### CODE OF ETHICS IN RESEARCH:

- a) Researchers at BWU are required to demonstrate intellectual and moral honesty in proposing, conducting, and reporting research.
- b) Any student, faculty member, researcher, staff should be responsible in the conduct of research, thesis, dissertation, promotion of academic integrity and prevention of misconduct including plagiarism in academic writing
- c) All members undertaking research should adhere to the University Grants Commission (Promotion of Academic Integrity and Prevention of Plagiarism in Higher Educational Institutions) Regulations, 2018
- d) All researchers, students, staff should open an account in URKUND via the University coordinator and get their written research documents checked for plagiarism.
- e) M.Phil./Ph.D students need to fill up a self-declaration form that the contents of the thesis/dissertation are not plagiarized, wherever required necessary citations have been given. In case, they have any doubts regarding citations, they must discuss with their research guides in detail.

- f) All researchers should be careful in making no misrepresentation in the dissemination of research information and findings and not fabricating data or information in their presentations/publications/reports.
- g) The researcher, faculty staff or student undertaking research should designate authorship of consulted research sources clearly, accurately and justly and assign authorship of research publications accurately and justly.
- h) The members must take responsibility for their actions and their commitments to research.
- i) All members undertaking research are expected to conduct themselves with the interests of the University and their own professional integrity in view and uphold the same to the scientific community and society at large. Bias, prejudice, conflict of interest or undue influence must not be permitted to supersede the professionalism of their conduct.
- j) All researchers must ensure that their personal views, convictions, previous experiences or future ambitions do not compromise the objective scientific process, the performance of their official duties or the interests of NIPS.
- k) The researchers should not resort to self-plagiarism or unexplained duplication of publication i.e., they should not publish same article in two different places. The same is applicable for abstracts.
- Students or faculty members while going for data collection to other institutes must carry
  a Letter under college letter head signed by the concerned head (guide/project
  director/director research) and their University ID Cards. They need to maintain a record
  of the institutes visited, persons interviewed/met for research data collection etc.

### FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO FACULTY FOR RESEARCH:

- i. The college provides financial support by reimbursing registration fees only for presenting papers in reputed National/International conferences held within India and for attending FDP/STTP/workshop/Seminar in other organizations in India.
- ii. Faculty would also look for an alternate source of funding for participation in a conference viz., AICTE/UGC etc.
- iii. The faculty can avail OD for attending the conference/FDP/STTP/workshop/Seminar. Students are informed about R&D initiatives by the respective departmental R&D coordinator.
- iv. Students shall approach the departmental R&D coordinator & Subject Expert Students submit application duly signed by HOD through their department R&D coordinator to the Institute R&D incharge.
- V. Student registers for the event & attends the same Reimbursement Receipt of registration fees, first page of paper Conference certificate to accounts department for final Reimbursement Approval from Department R&D coordinator for Participation Approval from Institute R&D Incharge and Principal.
- vi. The faculty should fill the required forms, get the approval and submit the same to the office before proceeding for the same.
- vii. The total cost of organizing any technical event for student and faculty will be borne by the institute.

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
